Congratulations! You've signed up for an audition! Now what?

Your audition will take about an hour. You will be auditioning with 10 other performers. When you first arrive, you'll review your audition form to make sure everything is still current. PLEASE take time to review any conflicts you may have in your schedule. If you decide to NOT audition, please email Allison at <u>allison@treasurevalleychildrenstheater.com</u> so we can open your spot for someone else.

Prepare a monologue.

You should practice and memorize a 1 minute monologue of your choice. Please do not select a scene from Robin Hood. You also have the option of telling an original story that you have practiced and can perform.

Get some rest and drink plenty of water.

Auditioning can be scary. We get it! You can help your mind and body prepare by getting a good night's sleep and eating nutritious foods. Going for a walk or swim may help alleviate any nerves you're feeling.

Dress for movement.

Part of your audition involves learning some choreography. This will be some basic stage combat and dance. No, this is not a musical, but movement plays a big part. On your audition day, don't worry about dressing to impress, we want you comfortable! T-shirts, leggings and shorts are perfect! If you have long hair, please pull it out of your face.

Be prepared for a cold read.

What this means is that we will be giving you "sides" (selections from the script) to read unprepared. Just because you read for one role doesn't mean we're not considering you for a different role. Just do the best you can and interpret the lines as best as you can. Be original! Try not to copy the style of the person that auditions before you.

What if I don't get cast?

Try not to let that get you down. Remember that there are only 16 roles and the director team only has an hour to get to know you! Keep auditioning and continue taking classes. We want to see you again!
